### **Immunisation Education Sessions** (*outcomes may vary slightly on the day*)

Cervical screening in Australia has changed. The National HPV Vaccination Program coupled with the new Cervical Screening Test is expected to reduce the number of women diagnosed with cervical cancer by up to 36%.
