


Hepatitis B for Nurses and Midwives

The course includes presentations and case discussions that introduce the epidemiology and natural history of hepatitis B, vaccination, testing, fibrosis assessment, advanced liver disease, stigma and discrimination and the cultural context of hepatitis B nursing.

Learning Objectives:

Through online learning and virtual teaching, participants will learn to:

- Outline the epidemiology of hepatitis B and the risk factors for hepatitis B transmission.
- · Identify opportunities for screening and testing, vaccination and linkage to care
- Outline the nurses' and midwives role in providing culturally appropriate care, free from stigma and discrimination
- Outline the nurses' and midwives role in identifying, diagnosing, assessing, monitoring and treating patients with chronic hepatitis B and advanced liver disease.
- Utilise innovative strategies and models of care that exist to deliver care for patients with hepatitis B
