



ALTERNATIVE ACCESS MODEL EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Healthcare providers can now bulk order free National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP) test kits and offer them to eligible patients (50 -74 years of age) during an appointment. This model does not replace the existing kit mail out model, rather it enables direct engagement by a trusted healthcare provider among community members with low screening rates.

This alternative way of giving kits to eligible people will help remove barriers for those who have never screened or are under-screened and aims to address the lower participation rates of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, people with disabilities and those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

WA Department of Health are collaborating with WA Primary Health Alliance, Cancer Council WA, and WA Country Health Service to promote this initiative and are calling for Expressions of Interest to implement the model and develop processes that can support other practices in Western Australia.
