Education sessions will focus on assessment, early detection and management in primary care with interactive case study building sessions to promote connections between primary and specialist care.

This GP education activity is designed to provide participants with a deep educational experience and will require intensive participant involvement. A dedicated team of lead clinicians (geriatricians, palliative care specialists and stroke unit specialists) along with medical educators and facilitators, will be involved in the small workshops, to deliver the intensive activities and enhance the environment for a deeper learning experience.

Prior to the event, participants are required to attend a planning meeting to address their expectations for the workshops and case studies. It is also mandatory that all participants complete the assigned pre-activity work before attending on the day. The workshops are designed to provide a high level of GP to specialist personalised clinical engagement, in a dynamic digital learning framework. ***The participant number is therefore strictly limited and early registration with commitment to participate is required.***

Learning outcomes include:

1. In a clinical context, demonstrate concepts of integrated care with specific applications of HealthPathways.
2. Summarise the investigation of delirium and dementia, when to refer and to whom.
3. Describe clinical advice, referral options, support services and pathways of care for GPs, in the care of frail older adults in the community and residential aged care facilities.
4. Discuss the assessment and management of vascular and neuro-degenerative conditions affecting older adults.
5. Identify the clinical differences of the spectrum in cognitive decline in the context of frailty, delirium and dementia.
6. Identify how goals of care and advance care planning can contribute to end of life planning in the clinical context of advanced malignancy and dementia.
