Mood Disorders

Professor Sean Hood *MBBS MSc FRANZCP*

undertook his undergraduate medical degree at the University of Western Australia before completing formal postgraduate training in Psychiatry in Perth (Australia) and Bristol (United Kingdom) in 2003. Since 1999 he has worked with Professor David Nutt's Psychopharmacology Unit at the University of Bristol / Imperial College and continues to collaborate with this group closely.

It was in Bristol that Prof Hood first began investigating serotonergic systems in clinical anxiety disorders using the acute tryptophan depletion (ATD) technique and other challenges, and this body of work was the focus of his Masters' Degree in Affective Neuroscience (University of Maastricht, The Netherlands, 2003). Subsequently, he returned to Perth setting up a Clinical Psychopharmacology laboratory as a clinical academic in the University of Western Australia's Psychiatry & Clinical Neurosciences Unit. Additionally, he worked for 5 years as a General Practice Liaison Psychiatrist in Bentley, Perth.

Prof Hood was Chair of the Australian Pristiq Advisory Board and member of the Australian Cymbalta & Vortioxetine Advisory Boards. Sean is a psychiatrist in academic (**University of Western Australia**), public (**SCGH, Nedlands**) and private practice (**The Marian Centre, Wembley**). His public practice includes two days per week as Head of the SCGH MHU Treatment Resistant Anxiety and Mood Disorder Unit (TRAMD).

Professor Hood is Head of the UWA Division of Psychiatry, and Associate Dean (Community & Engagement) for the UWA Medical School, in the Faculty of Health & Medical Sciences.

Professor Joseph Lee *MBBS, FRANZCP* is a Consultant Psychiatrist with the NMHS Mental Health (Neurosciences Unit, Graylands Campus; rTMS Clinic, SCGH) and a Clinical Professor at the University of Western Australia. He is primarily a clinician active in clinical research. Pharmacotherapy of mood and psychotic disorders, Neuropsychiatry (Catatonia, Huntington's disease, acquired brain injury, autism and intellectual disability), and Brain Stimulations are areas of his special interest.

Dr Salam Hussain is a Consultant Psychiatrist at the Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital (SCGH), in the area of Consultation Liaison Psychiatry, Emergency Psychiatry, and a Lead Clinician for the Neuromodulation unit at the SCGH Day Procedure Unit. Adjunct Senior Clinical Lecturer at the School of Psychiatry & Clinical Neurosciences University of Western Australia. A qualified psychiatrist trained in Western Australia and Fellow of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists, and International Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association.
