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New fact sheet for the National General Practice Accreditation Scheme

The Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (the Commission) has published a new fact sheet designed to provide general practices with simplified guidance about the National General Practice Accreditation (NGPA) Scheme.

The NGPA Scheme was introduced in January 2017 with the primary aim of supporting the consistent accreditation of general practices nationally. Since introducing the NGPA Scheme, the Commission has implemented an approval process for accrediting agencies, formalised the accreditation cycle (including delivery of reports and remediation periods for non-compliances), and sought to standardise processes such as the provision of extensions and the process for relocation.

The new fact sheet subtitled *Key Actions for General Practices*, summarises some of these key activities and achievements, and will assist practices in understanding the role of the Commission and the NGPA Scheme's interaction with other stakeholders.

COVID-19 vaccine development update

The National Centre for Immunisation Research and Surveillance (NCIRS) COVID-19 vaccine development landscape webpage provides a summary of the current state of development of COVID-19 vaccines and clinical trials. Preparing the public for COVID-19 vaccines



There are currently more than 200 COVID-19 vaccines in development worldwide, with several now undergoing stage 3 trials. While a vaccine in 2021 appears likely, its delivery poses significant challenges.

This article from the Australian Journal of General Practice provides recommendations for primary health care to build confidence in, and encourage uptake of, the COVID-19 vaccine.

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Survey on the impact of COVID-19 on standard immunisation services

Monash University is conducting an evaluation of the impact of COVID-19 on the delivery of immunisation services within Australia. The objective of this survey is to understand how COVID-19 has impacted the delivery of immunisation services and any changes that have been implemented in an effort to maintain coverage.

Immunisation providers (including nurse immunisers, general practitioners, pharmacist immunisers) should access the survey link and can choose if they would like to complete the survey which is confidential and anonymous. No identifiable information about providers will be collected.

Immunosuppression and Vaccines – Fact Sheet

Immunosuppression occurs when a patient's immune system is weakened. For some vaccines, this means additional doses to account for suboptimal seroprotection. For others, the patient's history needs to be reviewed carefully to ensure they can receive the vaccine safely. A new factsheet from the Melbourne Vaccine Education Centre can be read here.

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Updated information now available regarding access to the Australian Immunisation Register

The Services Australia website has been updated to include information for different immunisation providers and organisations about accessing the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). This new information aims to assist providers in self-servicing when creating their PRODA account for access to the AIR and includes advice on how to link a PRODA account to the AIR. What are the recommendations for hepatitis B vaccine non-responders?

Individuals who do not mount an appropriate immune response to the primary hepatitis B vaccination course (i.e. who are not infected with hepatitis B virus and have had 3 appropriately spaced doses excluding birth dose and anti-HBs < 10mIU/mL) are recommended to receive further doses of hepatitis B vaccine and undergo serological testing. People can receive a single booster dose (4th dose) of vaccine to confirm non-responder status. People who still have anti-HBs < 10mIU/mL 4–6 weeks after receiving the booster should be tested for hepatitis B virus infection. If negative, they are recommended to receive 2 more doses of hepatitis B vaccine 1 month apart (i.e. to complete their second 3-dose course) and then re-test for anti-HBs level at least 4 weeks after the last dose.

The online Australian Immunisation Handbook has a dedicated hepatitis B disease section with further information about hepatitis B vaccine non-responders including the use of intradermal vaccination in non-responders and post-exposure management of persistent non-responders.

Veteran Health Check Program – Patient Information

The Veteran Health Check is a comprehensive health check designed specifically for veterans. It provides an opportunity to access early intervention care and appropriate referrals when needed by the veteran. It is an opportunity to establish a relationship with the patient and the GP in order to manage their health and enjoy better health outcomes both during and in the years after their transition to civilian life.

Virtual Classroom Sessions for Practice Managers -Understanding compliance requirements for accessing My Health Record

These accredited one-hour sessions will equip Practice Managers and administrative staff with a sound knowledge of how to implement and maintain policies and procedures to govern access to the My Health Record within their organisation. These sessions are CPD Accredited and will attract five CPD points for AAPM members.

These sessions will be run multiple times each week and cover the following topics:

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Virtual Clinical Information System (CIS) - Classroom Sessions now accredited for CPD points

The virtual classroom sessions that the Provider Adoption team are conducting for clinicians to access My Health Record through various clinical information systems (Best Practice, MedicalDirector, Zedmed, Genie and Communicare) have been accredited by:

These one-hour sessions are aimed at GPs, Specialists, Practice Managers and Practice Nurses interested in learning more about My Health Record and how to use it most effectively in routine practice. Using the Agency's Training platform, the instructor will demonstrate how to: access a patient's My Health Record via conformant software:

- use filters to find documents;
- view documents and overviews;
- enter access codes for patients with protected documents/records;
- upload documents to My Health Record; and
- ensure appropriate security and access governance mechanisms are in place.

Run via GoTo webinar platform, these sessions will afford an opportunity for participants to raise questions directly with the instructor and, if time permits, discuss other issues encountered in using My Health Record.

National Safety and Quality Primary Healthcare Standards

The Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (the Commission) is developing National Safety and Quality Primary Healthcare (NSQPH) Standards to assist primary healthcare services to minimise the risk of harm and improve care for patients. Following workshop sessions undertaken in 2019, the Commission now has a draft set of Standards available for feedback, with the intention that the NSQPH Standards will be finalised and published in 2021.

Consultation on the draft NSQPH Standards is open until Friday 27 November 2020.

TGA Product Defect Alert – Some Softmed surgical masks

A Product Defect Alert notice for **<u>some</u>** Softmed branded disposable surgical masks manufactured by Wuhan Topmed has been issued following the Therapeutic Goods Administration's (TGA) post market review on face masks.

TGA testing showed the masks did not perform, in relation to fluid resistance claims, as labelled.

The TGA advises if there are no alternatives, a face shield should be used in addition to a mask in high risk settings.

This alert **<u>does not</u>** relate to masks distributed by WA Primary Health Alliance from the national stockpile, however some of these defective masks are available in WA through commercial supply.

Not all Softmed masks are subject to the Product Defect Alert.
