New RACGP Standards for after-hours and medical deputising services

The latest set of RACGP Standards, tailored specifically for services providing care in the after-hours period, was recently released. The *Standards for after-hours and medical deputising services* (5th edition) utilises the modular structure established in the *Standards for general practices* (5th edition), but exchanges the *General Practice* module for the *After-hours and medical deputising services* (AHS) module.

Additionally, there have been modifications made within the Core and Quality Improvement modules to ensure all indicators are relevant to the requirements of the AHS setting.

To be accredited against these Standards, a service must meet the RACGP definition of an after-hours or medical deputising service.

The transitional period for these Standards runs from August 2018 to February 2019, during which time services can choose whether to be assessed against the *Standards for general practices* (4th edition, noting service-specific indicators) or the new *Standards for after-hours and medical deputising services*. From March 2019, all services seeking accreditation will be assessed against the new Standards.

Two recent meningococcal W cases

There have been two recent cases of meningococcal @ infection in children aged under five years who had not received their free paediatric meningococcal ACWY vaccination.

Providers are reminded that the paediatric meningococcal ACWY vaccine catch-up program is finishing at the end of 2018. Please note the following:

- Remember to catch up all children aged from 1 to 4 years who have not yet received their MenACWY vaccination.
- Only 47% of children in this age group have received a meningococcal ACWY vaccine so far, meaning over 73,000 children in the community remain unprotected.
- As an additional measure, the Department of Health will be sending out reminders to all parents of Western Australian children aged between 1 to 4years who have not yet received a free catch-up vaccine, to ensure their children are protected.
- The reminders will consist of an email, followed by an SMS text message one month later, and finally a letter to the home address after a further month. The reminders will be sent only to those without a dose of MenACWY vaccine recorded on the Australian Immunisation Register.

Stan Perron Immunisation Service at Perth Children's Hospital

The delivery of vaccines recommended on the Western Australian immunisation schedule to children attending Perth Children's Hospital (PCH), is an integral component of the strategy to reduce the burden of vaccine preventable diseases within the community. An opportunity for immunisation is available to all children and their families to attend the comprehensive Stan Perron Immunisation Centre led by the Infectious Diseases Department at PCH.

Practice Management Software advice following the National Immunisation Program Schedule changes

The National Immunisation Program (NIP) Immunisation Schedule changed on 1 July 2018.

It is important that immunisation providers upgrade their practice management software to the latest version once it is released. Where there are delays in the software release, providers must use the advice from the software provider to ensure all immunisation encounters are recorded accurately and transmitted to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). Dose numbers accepted by AIR are detailed below.





AIR requires timely and accurate information as this is used for a range of purposes, including assessing eligibility for family payments, entry to child care and school and assessing coverage.

Royal Perth Hospital GP notify now operational

GP notification is operational again from 21 August 2018 and notifications of new admissions, discharges and deaths are being sent.

The issue over recent weeks largely affected fax notifications. Only notifications triggered in the week prior to the restart could be faxed. Please check the date of the admission, discharge or death in the first paragraph to see if the notification was delayed. Older notifications were not be able to be resent.

Please note that the faxing of discharge summaries to GPs has continued, although some were delayed due to a critical issue in the fax-server that sends the discharge and emergency summaries for WA public hospitals. Secure electronic transmission has continued as usual. Transmission of discharge summaries by secure electronic messaging is preferred to fax. Please refer to Discharge Summaries on http://www.rph.wa.gov.au/For-health-professionals/GPs/Communication if you would like to change to secure messaging for inpatient discharge summaries. (Secure messaging is not available for GP Notify).

Many thanks to those GPs and practices who have responded to the request to re-register for GP Notify. RPH has received a huge response and these are being processed as quickly as possible. Notifications will not start until the registration is processed and the system is fixed. If you are still to respond, please ensure that you include all relevant details as we have had a number of incomplete responses.
