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Update: PIP QI & New Data Sharing Agreements

A big thankyou to all practices that have successfully completed their new Data Sharing Agreements (DSAs). For the first time, all DSAs have been issued using DocuSign which enables practices to sign and return the DSA electronically. The revised DSA forms part of a practice's eligibility for the Practice Incentive Program (PIP) Quality Improvement (QI) payment, and therefore needs to be returned before the first quarter end date (**15 October 2019**). If you do not return your new DSA by this date, it may affect your eligibility for a payment in this first quarter. If you have not received a new DSA, or you are unsure how to complete the DSA, please get in contact with Practice Assist by telephone (1800 2 ASSIST) or by email practiceassist@wapha.org.au as soon as possible.

Practices that are unable to submit data using PenCS because they have software that is not compatible with PenCS, are eligible to apply for a time-limited exemption from the Australian Department of Health (the Department). If your practice is interested in accessing this exemption, please read the information and complete the Exemption Form available from the Department's website: <http://bit.ly/2ofcmdF>. The Exemption Form will need to be provided to your PHL to arrange sign off by WAPHA before it can be submitted to the Department. Exemption forms must be completed and submitted to the Department by **11:59pm 15 October 2019** to be eligible for a first quarter exemption.

GP Urgent Care Network Pilot: Second round of applications now open

Essential criteria to become a GP Urgent Care practice include:

- Evidence of accreditation
- Capacity to provide appointments
- Provision of clinical handover back to the patients 'regular' GP
- Completion of evaluation documentation
- Use of Health Engine and/or HotDoc for online bookings
- Relationship with a local pathology and radiology provider

New Telehealth MBS items

From 1 November 2019, there will be 12 new Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) items for telehealth video consultations with patients living in rural and remote areas. The new items will be available to GPs and non-specialist medical practitioners, and can be used for patients who:

- are living in a Modified Monash Model (MMM) 6 or 7 area (use the online Health Workforce Locator to search the MMM map);
- have had three face-to-face professional attendances in the preceding 12 months from the practitioner who will provide the telehealth service; and
- at the time of the consultation, are at least 15 kilometers by road from the practitioner.

The new items have been made available to help address inequities in the provision of health care services and have the potential to deliver improved health outcomes to people living in rural and remote locations.

Coping with self-harm: a guide for parents and carers

A new youth mental health resource, “Coping with self-harm: A guide for parents and carers” has been developed by the Orygen National Centre of Excellence in Youth Mental Health with funding support from the Perth South Suicide Prevention Trial led by WA Primary Health Alliance.

This resource was adapted from a guide originally produced by researchers at the Centre for Suicide Research, University of Oxford, England and was adapted for an Australian audience following extensive consultation between Orygen, young people and their parents and carers.

It provides practical information on supporting a young person who is self-harming, managing their injuries, implementing coping strategies and where to go for help. It outlines the reasons for self-harm and what makes a young person vulnerable to self-harm, and practical ways a parent or carer can look after themselves during this time.

The guide is designed for parents and carers but is a useful resource for health professionals to reference and provide should they see presentation in their practice.
