

Identifying patients eligible for RSV vaccine using clinical database searches

Clinics using **BEST PRACTICE** medical software can search for RSV eligible patients via search queries within the Utilities tab.

On the startup blank page, go to Utilities ⇒ Search. A new page will appear with database search.

- For Aboriginal patients:
 - In demographics select 'ATSI'. Each option will need to be individually searched, i.e. "Aboriginal", "Torres Strait Islander" and "Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander"
 - Add date of birth from 1/10/2022
- For catch up babies
 - In demographics add "date of birth" ">= 1/10/2023"
- For medically at-risk patients.
 - In demographics add "date of birth" ">= 1/10/2022"
 - Go to "conditions" and add the relevant conditions.

Clinics using Medical Director software can search for RSV eligible patients via **MD Insights**. (NB Ensure that there has been a recent collection before running searches)

Body Navigate to the MD Insights tool:

- Under the MD Insights Demographics tab click on 'Age'
 - This will produce a chart with slices for each age bracket.
 - Click on the applicable age bracket and then hit 'View' to see a patient list
 - This list can be exported to excel or csv files for further filtering as required.
- Under the MD Insights Demographics tab click on 'Indigenous'
 - This will produce a chart with slices for each status.
 - Click on the applicable slice/slices and then hit 'View' to see a patient list
 - This list can be exported to excel or csv files for further filtering as required.
