Computer and Information Security Standards and Templates

The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) has developed a series of computer and information security standards (CISS) and associated templates.

These aim to provide general practices with information and recommendations to raise awareness of contemporary security issues and help protect against potential exposure to loss of sensitive data.

The CISS provides Australian general practice with a framework for evaluating risks, and guidance and solutions to improve competency and capacity in computer and information security. The second edition was released in October 2013 and includes additional information to support general practitioners and their practice teams to develop policies that relate to participation with the My Health Record, previously known as the Personally Controlled Electronic Health Record.

The computer and information security templates enable general practices to build a comprehensive suite of computer and information security policies and procedures.
