

# Primary Sense





## Reports for Patients living with Diabetes

Primary Sense can provide reports based on real-time data, allowing practices to monitor performance and focus on clinical outcomes. The features and functionality of reports can support roles across the practice team. Generated reports are automatically saved to a folder on the computer, enabling data comparison over time.

### Accessing reports for Diabetes

At the top of the Primary Sense sidebar menu: click **Reports** and select keyword filter: **Diabetes**

**Quick tip!**  
 You can track your practice's progress in Primary Sense using the 'Summary Report of Practice Improvements' under Practice/PHN Reports.

 <b>Diabetes Mellitus</b> Diagnosed and undiagnosed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify patients who may have Diabetes Mellitus but do not have the diagnosis coded.</li> <li>View number of practice patients with diabetes coded across 30-day intervals.</li> </ul>
 <b>Winter Wellness</b> High risk patients at risk of seasonal respiratory inf	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify patients with diabetes that may require a seasonal influenza vaccine.</li> </ul>
 <b>Patients booked in with missing PIP QI measures</b> With appointments in the next 2 weeks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify patients with missing measures (for diabetic patients this includes HbA1c, blood pressure and BMI) who have an upcoming booked appointment to enable these to be addressed during the consult.</li> </ul>
 <b>Patients missing PIP QI or accreditation Measures</b> All patients missing measures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify patients with missing measures (for diabetic patients this includes HbA1c, blood pressure and BMI). This can provide a baseline for data-driven improvement activities.</li> </ul>
For further interrogation of data to target specific areas otherwise not highlighted, reports can be exported to Excel or CSV for enhanced manipulation and filtering.	

### Quality improvement (QI) opportunities

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop a process to recall patients with Diabetes for a seasonal influenza vaccine.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop a process to identify and recall patients with Diabetes that may not have all pathology and screening up to date as per recommended management.</li> </ul>
