## Maintaining access to primary care during emergencies and disaster

Telehealth in emergency and disaster situations involves using telecommunication technologies to provide health care services when traditional face-to-face consultations are not possible.

This can include video consultations, remote monitoring and virtual case conferences. The relevance of telehealth in these scenarios is particularly significant for general practitioners (GPs) as it allows them to maintain access to primary care for patients, ensuring continuity of care even when physical access is restricted or dangerous.

WA Primary Health Alliance's General Practice Emergency Response Team identified the need to increase general practice confidence in the use of telehealth and the application of telehealth in disasters and emergencies.
