GO LIVE: Monday 16th February 2026

*Public outpatient specialist medical services delivered by WACHS Midwest
are coming into scope for the Central Referral Service (CRS).*

What is changing?

From 16 February 2026, CRS will be the single intake point for referrals from GPs, Nurse Practitioners and private specialists to **in-scope** public outpatient specialist medical services provided by WACHS Midwest (see list overleaf).

CRS will:

- ✓ Check required referral information is included
- ✓ Allocate referrals to the most appropriate regional or metro hospital site based on what WACHS Midwest can and can't provide (*supporting care closer to home, where available*)
- ✓ Notify referrers when their referral has been allocated to a hospital specialty by CRS
- ✓ Notify referrers and patients when their referral has been accepted by a hospital site

CRS do not:

- ✓ Triage referrals or book appointments - this is still managed by local WACHS hospital sites
- ✓ Process or pass private referrals - continue to send these referrals directly to provider

What do GPs need to do at 'Go-Live'?

1. Send referrals for in-scope public outpatient specialist medical services to CRS, via:

- Healthlink Secure Messaging: **crefserv** (*preferred*)

At GO-LIVE, referrals must be sent to CRS (for access to Midwest public services below):

- ✓ Dermatology (C,E)
- ✓ Gynaecology (G,C,E)
- ✓ Haematology (G,C,E)
- ✓ Medical Oncology (G,C,E)
- ✓ Ophthalmology * (C)
- ✓ Paediatrics (Med. and Dev.) (G,C,E)
- ✓ Renal Medicine (G,C)
- ✓ Rheumatology * (G)
- ✓ Urology * (C)

OUT OF SCOPE

Referrals to the following WACHS Midwest public outpatient services must not be sent to CRS:

- ✗ Immediate referrals (to be seen ≤7 days)
 - including fracture clinic
- ✗ Allied Health services
- ✗ Child Development Services
- ✗ Mental Health services
- ✗ Non-doctor led services e.g.:
 - Outpatient nursing services
 - Continence and Stoma
 - Palliative Care
- ✗ Obstetrics and Antenatal services
- ✗ Geriatric Medicine
- ✗ Private services

Continue existing site referral process

Please note private access may also be available in region for some medical specialties.
CRS does not process or pass referrals to private providers. Continue existing direct referral pathways for private access.
