

# Quality Improvement (QI) Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA)

<b>QI activity focus / Objective</b>		Increase the number of Event Summaries uploaded to My Health Record

<p><b>Step 1: PLAN</b></p> <p>What do you plan to do/achieve</p>	<p><b>Goal:</b> Over the next three months, increase the number of Event Summaries uploaded to My Health Record for treatment room procedures by 30%, by introducing a consent form prompt that triggers a follow-up task for clinical staff to complete the upload.</p> <p><b>Change Idea:</b> Add a question to the existing treatment room consent form asking patients whether they agree to an Event Summary being uploaded to their My Health Record. This question acts as a workflow trigger, not a formal consent requirement (as written consent isn't required), prompting staff to complete an upload task in the clinical software.</p>
<p><b>Step 2: DO</b></p> <p>Outline the steps you will undertake</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Update the digital or paper consent form to include the new prompt.</li> <li>2. Educate Treatment Room nurses and admin staff about:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Why Event Summaries matter for clinical handover</li> <li>○ That this is not written consent, just a workflow trigger</li> <li>○ How to complete the generated task</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. Run the test for <b>2–4 weeks</b> on:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ wound care appointments</li> <li>○ excisions</li> <li>○ immunisation visits</li> <li>○ spirometry or similar sessions</li> </ul> </li> <li>4. Collect data on:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ how often the question is completed</li> <li>○ how many tasks are generated</li> <li>○ how many Event Summaries are uploaded</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
<p><b>Step 3: STUDY</b></p> <p>What did you observe?</p>	<p><b>What to Examine</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Compare baseline upload numbers with post implementation numbers.-implementation numbers.</li> <li>• Review staff feedback:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Did the prompt work smoothly?</li> <li>○ Were tasks easy to action?</li> <li>○ Any missed or duplicated tasks?</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Check quality of Event Summary content (appropriate details included?).</li> <li>• Identify barriers:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Time pressure?</li> <li>○ Staff forgetting?</li> <li>○ Technical issues with task creation?</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>Questions to Ask</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Did adding the prompt actually increase uploads?</li> <li>• Were uploads completed closer to time of care than before?</li> <li>• Did any patients present elsewhere where the Event Summary may have been helpful?</li> </ul>
<p><b>Step 4: ACT</b></p> <p>Will you adopt, adapt or abandon this change?</p>	<p><b>Choose one of the following:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Adopt</b> if uploads increased and staff found the workflow straightforward.</li> <li>• <b>Adapt</b> if:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ the prompt needs rewording</li> <li>○ triggering the task isn't reliable</li> <li>○ certain appointment types need a different workflow</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Abandon</b> if the process creates administrative burden or does not improve upload rates.</li> </ul>

### 10 PIP QI Measures.

1. diabetes with HbA1c result
2. smoking status
3. weight classification
4. 65+ and Influenza Immunisation
5. Diabetes and Influenza Immunisation
6. COPD and Influenza Immunisation
7. alcohol consumption status
8. risk factors enable CVD assessment
9. cervical screening
10. diabetes & blood pressure
